DAY-BY-DAY ITINERARY

THU 21 OCT Depart U.S.

Our African adventure begins today when we depart for the overnight, transatlantic flight to Johannesburg. (Meals in-flight)

FRI 22 OCT Arrival Cape Town

Connect in Johannesburg to arrive this evening in Cape Town. Our local, English-speaking guide will be waiting to assist with arrival and transfer to our hotel for check-in. The Portswood Hotel (Meals in-flight)

SAT 23 OCT Cape Peninsula

This morning after breakfast, embark on an excursion of discovery, touring the Cape Peninsula. Drive via the exclusive suburbs of Bantry Bay, Camps Bay and Hout Bay. Continue over the magnificent Chapman's Peak Drive (provided the road is open) to Cape Peninsula National Park. The Cape of Good Hope and Cape Point form part of the park and are managed by the South African National Parks. Visitors can enjoy the 19,000-acre reserve of indigenous flora and fauna and over 150 species of birds. From here travel onto the Boulders Beach Penguin Colony and the naval hamlet of Simon's Town. Visitors have access to well-placed wooden walkways allowing guests the opportunity to view the penguins in their natural habitat. On the return drive stop at Sunny Cove Manor to enjoy "tea" with longtime Denver friends and former African missionaries Peter and Solveig Kjeseth. The Portswood Hotel (B, tea)

SUN 24 OCT Cape Town City Tour/Robben Island

Worship with Dr. M.L. Adams at Atlantis Beacon Hill Church. Dr. Adams and his congregation are representative of the "coloureds" of South Africa – mixed-race descendants of Europe, Africa and India. He and his parishioners will share the history of this forgotten people in South Africa, who mainly live in the Western Cape region. After worship embark on an orientation tour of the "Mother City," Cape Town. Ascend Table Mountain by aerial cable car (weather permitting). View a breathtaking panorama of the city, Table Bay, Robben Island, the Atlantic seaboard and most of the spectacular Cape Peninsula. Then travel to the charming Malay Quarter with its narrow cobbled streets. Continue to the V&A Waterfront from where you board the ferry to Robben Island (weather permitting) for a tour of the island, including a visit to the prison where Nelson Mandela was held. You are led through by guides who themselves were once incarcerated here as political prisoners. This evening you'll delight in dinner at the Africa Café – sample delicious dishes from all over Africa. The Portswood Hotel (B, D)

MON 25 OCT Cape Town/Oudtshoorn

Get an early start this morning for your journey along the Southern Cape route to Oudtshoorn. Visit the town of Stellenbosch for a wine tasting and cellar tour before heading to the world's feather capital, Oudtshoorn, so named after the abundance of ostrich farms in this area. Enjoy dinner at the hotel. Oudtshoorn or Queens Hotel (B, D)

TUE 26 OCT Oudtshoorn/Knysna

Start the day with a visit to the magnificent Cango Caves. Tucked away in the foothills of the Swartberg Mountains, only 19 miles from Oudtshoorn, lie the Cango Caves - a place of great natural beauty, and a national monument. For more than 20 million years, rainwater has flowed

through fissures and seeped through cracks in the earth's surface, scouring and dissolving rock and limestone to form the vast halls and tunnels of the Cango Cave system. Enjoy a one-hour guided tour through the incredible fairyland of columns, crystal curtains and a fantasia of flow-stone formations. Afterwards visit a local ostrich farm for a tour of the facility, learning more about these flightless birds before traveling to Knysna in the afternoon. Enjoy dinner at a local restaurant. Protea Hotel Knysna Quays (B, D)

WED 27 OCT Knysna

After breakfast embark on a Featherbed excursion. The world famous landmark, the spectacular Knysna Heads, consists of two giant sandstone cliffs which mark the Knysna River's entrance. Featherbed Nature Reserve, a unique 370-acre private nature reserve, encompasses the whole of the Western Head of Knysna and is one of South Africa's Natural Heritage Sites. Stopping at a scenic lookout point, specialist guides share with you some fascinating tales about Knysna and the surrounding area while you enjoy the panoramic views. An optional 1.5-mile guided nature walk takes you through the forest, onto the cliffs, into the caves and along the scenic coast. Enjoy lunch under the Milkwood Trees before the ferry returns to the Featherbed Ferry Terminal in the Knysna Quays. Protea Hotel Knysna Quays (B, L)

THU 28 OCT Knysna/Port Elizabeth/Durban

Enjoy breakfast and check out of the hotel before transferring to Port Elizabeth Airport. Travel via the village of Plettenberg Bay, passing the Tsitsikamma National Park before reaching the airport for the flight to Durban. Arriving at Durban International Airport you are transferred to your hotel for check-in. Enjoy dinner at the hotel. Southern Sun Elangeni (B, D)

FRI 29 OCT Durban/Swaziland

Depart Durban early this morning, heading towards a local Zulu village for a tour of the facility where you will learn more about this interesting culture. Continue to the tiny mountainous kingdom of Swaziland arriving in the early evening. Enjoy dinner at the hotel. Lugogo Sun (B, D)

SAT 30 OCT Swaziland/Mpumalanga

This morning visit a typical Swazi market. Bid Swaziland farewell as you head back into South Africa entering the Mpumalanga Province, fondly known as "land of the rising sun." Spend the rest of the afternoon at leisure prior to dinner at your hotel. Protea Hotel Kruger Gate (B, D)

SUN 31 OCT Mpumalanga

Today spend the day on a game drive in open safari vehicles in Kruger National Park. The park spans across from the Mpumalanga region into the Limpopo, stretching for 230 miles from north to south along the Mozambique border on the eastern side. Wild dog, cheetah, zebra, giraffe and a variety of other species, along with the Big Five (so named due to the difficulty in hunting these five species: elephant, rhino, buffalo, lion and leopard) are found in Kruger National Park. A lunch stop is included. Enjoy dinner in the evening at the lodge. Protea Hotel Kruger Gate (B, L, D)

MON 01 NOV Mpumalanga

Depart to the breathtaking Panorama Route featuring the Blyde River Canyon, Bourke's Luck Potholes, God's Window and Lisbon Waterfalls. Not only are these places visually attractive, but photo opportunities are great. Travel via the town of Graskop to Pilgrim's Rest to explore this village at your leisure. In the late afternoon proceed to White River and enjoy dinner at the hotel. Protea Hotel Winkler (B, D)

TUE 02 NOV White River/Johannesburg

Depart Mpumalanga and start your journey to Johannesburg arriving in the late afternoon. Spend the remainder of the day at leisure relaxing or embarking on last minute shopping at the nearby Sandton City Shopping Complex. Enjoy a farewell dinner at a local restaurant. Protea Hotel Balalaika (B, D)

WED 03 NOV Johannesburg/Depart to U.S.

Spend the morning at leisure, then enjoy lunch at a local restaurant, followed by a half-day tour of Soweto. Highlights of this tour include a fascinating glimpse into bustling neighborhood life; two Nobel Prizewinners' previous residences: the Hector Peterson Memorial and the Nelson Mandela House Museum. Late this afternoon transfer to O.R. Tambo International Airport for flight check-in and departure. (B, L, Meals in-flight)

THU 04 NOV Return to U.S.

After clearing U.S. Immigration and Customs, connect with your homeward bound flight. Arrive home today enriched by the fun and fascination of your South African adventure. (Meals in-flight)

OPTIONAL EXTENSION TO VICTORIA FALLS

WED 03 NOV Johannesburg/Victoria Falls

Breakfast and check-out prior to your transfer with a local English speaking driver to O.R. Tambo International Airport to connect with your flight to Victoria Falls. Arriving at Victoria Falls International Airport you are met by a local English-speaking representative and escorted to your waiting vehicle. Transfer to your hotel and spend the remainder of the day at leisure. Victoria Falls Hotel

THU 04 NOV Victoria Falls

After a delicious breakfast embark on a walking tour of Victoria Falls from the Zimbabwe side. The sight of millions of gallons of turbulent water cascading over a sheer precipice into a narrow gorge a hundred meters below is a sight you'll never forget (water levels are season dependent). Return to the hotel in time for lunch (at your own expense) and spend the remainder of the day at leisure until your sundowner cruise on the Zambezi River. Victoria Falls Hotel (B)

FRI 05 NOV Victoria Falls/Depart to U.S.

After breakfast and hotel check-out, transfer to Victoria Falls International Airport for the return flight to Johannesburg. Connect with the late afternoon flight to the U.S. (B, Meals in-flight)

SAT 06 NOV Return to U.S.

After clearing U.S. Immigration and Customs, connect with your homeward bound flight. Arrive home today enriched by the fun and fascination of your South African adventure. (Meals in-flight)

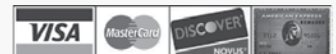

TOUR CONDITIONS

PAYMENT SCHEDULE: Your reservation and deposit of \$750 per person are requested immediately to fulfill the group deadline requirements. Note that space is limited and reservations are taken on a first come, first served basis. A second payment of \$1000 is due June 18, 2010. Final payment is due August 17, 2010. For credit card payment Group Travel Directors accepts Visa, MasterCard, Discover or American Express.

REFUND POLICY: All cancellations must be in writing. There is no refund for partial or unused land arrangements. Note: Airline tickets will be issued well in advance prior to departure and may be nonrefundable.
